REFRESHED

Acts 3:19 contains some very meaningful words that speak to the soul, "when the times of refreshing shall come from the presence of the Lord." This phrase is in the middle of the sermon being preached by Peter. He is reminding the people that Jesus has the power to enable a lame man to walk, but more importantly, He has the power to refresh a lost soul when that person repents, is converted, and enjoys their sins being blotted out. That is, we can have a lame soul that has no walk with the Lord. We as Christians can be converted and saved, but are missing the refreshing presence of the Lord.

I have some apps on my phone that have information that needs to be updated. I can hit a certain place on my phone and it "refreshes" the site so that I can get the latest information. Does your pastor need to be refreshed? Yes! How does this happen for him? Let me testify to this. I have been recently blessed by some fifty members who are in the midst of our study called "Experiencing God." I cannot tell you how many times I have led this study since 1991, but I can assure you that I am refreshed by the spiritual appetites

met with spiritual nourishment.

Being reminded of Jesus as our model for ministry refreshes me again in this outline:

- 1. The Father has been working right up until now.
- 2. Now the Father has me working.
- 3. I do nothing on my own initiative.
- 4. I watch to see what the Father is doing.
- 5. I do what I see the Father doing.
- 6. The Father loves Me.
- 7. He shows Me everything He is doing.

I could easily study Jesus' words in the Bible and put a verse or verses next to each of the above statements reminding me of the relationship Jesus had with His Father.

Being a student of the Scripture and applying God's Words in a personal way refreshes me.

I am also refreshed by the people of God depending on God and each other in such a loving way. When Adam Johnson called upon us to pray for him and his family because of the new pregnancy, I was so grateful that he not only trusted us with this information, but depended on us to pray.

What a blessing it is to serve within a Church family that truly cares for one another. The outpouring of love refreshes me.

I experience the presence of God with disciples who love the Word and love each other. Thank you for providing the refreshment!!!!

As we conclude the first full month of 2017, it's obvious that God is actively at work in our church at large, as well as, in the environment of our student ministry. Of the five Wednesday night services thus far in 2017, no two have been alike. Finding benefits and momentum with one large group teaching environment, ten to twelve small groups, and guest speakers, we are endeavoring to utilize different teaching methods to spur spiritual growth. God has blessed our student ministry with more and more students who are hungry for the Word and, at the same time, blessed us with more committed adult volunteers than I've ever seen anywhere.

It's obvious that PHBC has a heart for sharing the gospel with the students and families of our community. Some of the changes we've made to better accommodate this influx has been to build a portable dividing wall across the center of the gym to allow for youth services to be moved out into the larger gym area.
